






Compared to the situation before the "Rose Revolution" in 2003, now the Georgian courts work . . . (%)






Compared to the situation before the "Rose Revolution" in 2003, now the Georgian courts work ... BY Is Georgia a democracy? (%)




Georgians are divided and uncertain over legal system



Level of trust in judges and courts (%)






To what extent do you agree or disagree with the opinion that the judges are independent in Georgia? (%)




Judges are independent in Georgia BY Settlement type (%)




Unsure if courts are fair, divided on justice

To what extent do you agree or disagree with the opinion that Georgian judges are fair? (%)






Which of the following statements do you agree with? (%)

Statement 1: Court should always strictly punish the offenders according to the law Statement 2: Court should sometimes take into consideration the circumstances




How often do the judges make mistakes that lead to non-guilty people's conviction? (%)




Suppose two neighbors have a dispute over land plot. How independent and fair do you think the judge will be while deciding this case? (%)




Suppose you have a dispute with a state body over a fine that you think you did not deserve. How fair do you think the judge will be while deciding this case?



When a person sues a state body, the judge will generally favor the state body over the person (%)




Judges in Georgia serve the government's interests (%)




Whom or what do the Georgian judges depend on most? (%)

(This question was only asked to those respondents who tend to think that judges are not independent - 40%)




Bringing a case to the court will make the problem worse (%)






When you think of the Georgian judiciary, which comes to your mind most often? (%)




Have you heard about introduction of jury in Georgia? (%)




Have you heard about 'plea bargaining'? (%)




The Head of the Supreme Court of Georgia is legally allowed to alter decisions of all Georgian courts (%)




The President of Georgia is legally allowed to dismiss the Supreme Court of Georgia (%)



Have you heard about free legal aid provided by the state? BY Court experience (%)




Have you heard about free legal aid provided by NGOs? BY Court experience (%)





Most important issue in Georgia (%)




Have you, your family member, your close relative or close friend had any court experience during the last 2 years? (%)




In whose favour was the decision made? (%)

(This question was only asked to those respondents who had any court experience during the last 2 years and whose court case is already finished)




How fair do you think the decision of the court was? (%)
